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The Domestic Economy

Domestic Economic Conditions

Production




Figure 1. Talamahu Market Production

Domestic agricultural produces supplied to the Talamahu Market increased by 18.3 percent during the first half of the 2002/03 financial year, compared with 18.2 percent decline during the previous six months and 53.4 percent increase during the same period last year. The increase in local supplies was attributed mainly to seasonal increase in supplies of fruits and vegetables such as pawpaw, pineapple, tomatoes, lettuces and cabbages. However, supplies of root crops, such as swamp taro, yams and cassava to Talamahu Market declined, which could be due to the increase in exports of root crops overseas. Supplies of local produces to village markets and roadside stalls are excluded in the Talamahu Market survey (*Figure 1, S22*).

Provisional estimates made by the Statistics Department, indicated that exports of root crops during the six months ended December 2002, (which included kape, cassava, swamp taro, taro taruas, yams and sweet potatoes) increased by 43.3 percent, compared with a 55.7 percent decrease during the previous six months and 47.0 percent increase during the same period last year. The increase in exports of root crops mainly reflected increases in exports of swamp taro, kape, and cassava (*S31*).

According to the Ministry of Labour, Commerce and Industry, squash exports amounted to 18,024 tonnes during the first half of the 2002/03 financial year. This was 2.4 percent higher than the 17,602 tonnes exported during the same period last year. The successful squash season in 2001 attracted more squash exporting companies to grow more acreage in 2002. However, the weather condition was not favourable for squash growing this

season, therefore, the yield was not as high as expected. Moreover the average price per kilogram to growers was reported to be lower than the \$1.04 seniti recorded last year.

Provisional data provided by the Statistics Department indicated that the exports of vanilla amounted to \$4.2 million, during the six months ended December 2002. The price quoted from Madagascar showed that during this period, vanilla prices remained high at an average of US\$215 per pound. This was higher than the US\$200 per pound quoted during the previous six months but lower than the US\$230 per pound quoted during the same period last year. The amount of vanilla exported during the period increased to 12,853 kilograms compared with 5 kilograms exported during the previous six months (S31).

According to provisional data provided by the Statistics Department and a survey conducted by the Reserve Bank, kava exports increased during the six months ended December 2002, both in quantities and receipts, despite the restrictions imposed on the use of kava for pharmaceutical purposes in Europe. Kava exports, at almost 19 tonnes, were higher than the 10.8 tonnes exported during the previous six months and the 14.9 tonnes during the same period last year. Receipts amounted to \$1.0 million for the six months ended December 2002, compared with the \$0.2 million recorded for the previous six months and \$0.3 million during the same period last year.

Fishing




Figure 2. Fishing Activity (NRBT Survey)

Activities in the fishing sector continued to decline during the six months ended December 2002. The survey conducted by the Reserve Bank indicated that the volume of fresh fish exported decreased by 34 percent compared with the 40 percent decline during the six months ended June 2002, and the 3 percent increase during the same period last year. The decline in fish exports was attributable to factors such as the warmer weather conditions brought about by the Elnino, less available airfreight space for fish exports and some major fish export companies leaving the industry. The outlook for the next 3 months is for a similar declining trend (*Figure 2*).

Tourism




Figure 3. Total number of Air Arrivals

The number of people who arrived in Tonga by air reached 20,234 at the end of December 2002. This represented a 23.7 percent increase compared with the 11.9 percent decrease recorded during the previous six months and the 34.4 percent increase during the same period last year. People arriving from New Zealand accounted for 36.1 percent of total arrivals, followed by the United States, 19.7 percent, and Australia, 17.8 percent compared with 37.6 percent, 18.8 percent and 18.0 percent respectively during the same period of the previous year (*Figure 3, S33*).

Based on overseas exchange transaction records, tourists receipts was estimated at \$12.4 million during the six months ended December 2002, compared with \$4.8 million recorded for the six months ended June 2002 and \$7.5 million for the six months ended December 2001.

Construction

During the six months ended December 2002, some of the major construction projects completed included the LDS Koulo, LDS Neiafu (1 & 2) and LDS Longolongo. Other major construction projects that started during this period included the FIFA Goal project (stadium and playing fields), LDS Kolomotu'a and the World Bank Houses Project at Vava'u. Sales of construction materials during the first half of the 2002/03 financial year were 11.5 percent higher than the previous six months, but lower than the 37.5 percent increase during the same period last year.

Wholesale and Retail

According to a survey conducted by the Reserve Bank (covering vehicle, supermarkets and household goods), wholesale and retail sales rose by 9.2 percent during the six months ended December 2002, compared with 1.9 percent increase during the six months ended June 2002 and 23.0 percent increase during the same period last year. Vehicle sales expanded by 86.0 percent while supermarket sales increased slightly by 0.6 percent.

Electricity




Figure 4. Electricity Consumed (Kwh '000)

During the first six months of the 2002/2003 financial year, electricity consumption at 19.4 million Kwh., rose by 6.0 percent, compared with 2.6 percent increase during the previous six months, and 1.0 percent increase during the same period last year. At the same time, the number of active consumers rose by 12.4 percent to 20,048 consumers, compared with the 5.5 percent decline during the previous six months and the 4.7 percent increase during the same period of last year. Electricity prices remained unchanged at 37.50 seniti per kilowatt for Tongatapu and 40.0 seniti for the outer islands (*Figure 4, S20*).

Inflation

In December 2002, the Consumer Price Index (CPI) for Tonga was rebased from November 1995 to November 2002. The basket composition and weighting were based on the Household Income and Expenditure Survey (HIES) conducted by the Statistics Department during 2000/01 financial year. The distribution of weights of local and imported component in the new base (33.8 percent and 66.2 percent respectively) indicates the vulnerability of changes in CPI to changes in the imported component.




Figure 5. CPI, Base Period: Nov 2002=100 (annual percent change)

Measured by CPI, inflation reached 12.0 percent for the year ended December 2002, compared with 10.7 percent for the year ended June 2002 and 10.7 percent for the year ended December 2001. The imported component of CPI rose by 12.0 percent while the domestic component rose by 13.5 percent. Food prices rose by 17.2 percent over the year ended December 2002, compared with 18.8 percent increase for the year ended June 2002 and 19.6 percent during the year ended December 2001 (*Figure 5, S24*).

Domestic Prices

Domestic prices increased by 13.5 percent during the year ended December 2002, compared with 11.8 percent increase during the year ended June 2002. The increase in domestic prices reflected an increase of 50.3 percent in clothing and footwear prices, compared with the 2.3

percent decline during the year ended June 2002. Other categories that contributed to the increase in domestic prices during the year ended December 2002, were food (22.8 percent), tobacco and alcohol (9.6 percent).

Import Prices

Import prices increased by 12.0 percent during the year ended December 2002, higher than the 9.8 percent increase during the year ended June 2002. The increase in import prices reflected an increase of 18.3 percent in prices of imported clothing and footwear. Other major categories that contributed to the increase in import prices were household goods (17.8 percent) and food (14.7 percent).

Overseas Exchange Transactions (OET)

The following information represents an unofficial compilation of the balance of payments prepared by the Reserve Bank on the basis of the foreign exchange operations of the banking system (S29).

Total receipts during the first six months of the 2002/03 financial year, were \$147.9 million, compared with \$133.6 million in the same period of the previous year.

Export receipts reached \$25.6 million during the six months ended December 2002, compared with \$13.2 million during the previous six months and \$25.5 million during the same period of the previous year. The higher export receipts during this period was led by squash exports. Private transfers peaked at \$79.0 million over the six months ended December 2002, higher than the \$69.9 million recorded in the previous six months, and \$72.2 million in the same period of the preceding year. Other private services receipts, at \$11.2 million were higher than the \$6.9 million recorded in the previous six months, and \$9.4 million during the corresponding period of the previous year. Capital inflows recorded an amount of \$13.5 million during the six months ended December 2002, compared with \$28.3 million during the previous six months, and \$12.8 million during the same period of the preceding year.

Total payments for the first six months of the 2002/03 financial year were \$139.0 million, a 26.2 percent increase, compared with the 10.6 percent decrease during the previous six months, and the 21.8 percent increase during the same period of the preceding year. The increase in outflows reflected higher payments for imports, transportation, travel and investment income during the period. Imports of goods accounted for 60.3 percent of total payments, transportation and private transfer payments accounted for 9.4 percent and 8.5 percent respectively, and capital outflow contributed 5.3 percent.

Merchandise imports recorded a total of \$82.7 million during the first half of the 2002/03 financial year, a 29.9 percent increase compared with the 9.0 percent decline in the previous six months and the 9.5 percent increase in the same period of the previous year. The higher private capital payments were more than offset by the lower official capital payments which resulted in an overall decline in capital outflows of \$8.5 million from \$10.9 million during the six months ended June 2002 and \$14.4 million during the same period of the previous year.

The trade balance recorded a deficit of \$57.1 million during the first six months of the 2002/03 financial year, 12.7 percent higher than the \$50.4 million deficit recorded during the six months ended June 2002, and 27.6 percent higher than the \$44.5 million deficit during the same period of the previous year. This deficit was more than offset by other net current account inflows, mainly unrequited transfers, which resulted in a current account surplus of \$3.9 million compared with the \$3.7 million surplus recorded during the six months ended June 2002, and \$12.1 million surplus in the same period of the previous year.




Figure 6. OET Trade and Current Account Balance

The current account surplus of \$3.9 million and the net capital inflows of \$5.0 million, more than offset other unrecorded net outflows of \$3.8 million. Overall, a balance of payments surplus of \$5.1 million was recorded in the first half of the 2002/03 financial year. This was lower than the surplus of \$9.9 million in the previous six months, but higher than the \$3.9 million surplus in the same period of the previous year (*Figure 6, S29*).

Gross Official Foreign Reserves




Figure 7. Gross Official Foreign Reserves and Import Coverage (\$m:months)

At the end of December 2002, the gross official foreign reserves stood at \$44.7 million, compared with \$39.6 million at the end of June 2002, and \$29.7 million at the end of December 2001 (*Figure 7, S28*).

At the end of December 2002, the level of official foreign reserves was equivalent to 2.7 months of imports, compared with 2.5 months at the end of June 2002, and 2.3 months at the end of December 2001.

Domestic Financial Conditions

Money Supply




Figure 8. Money Supply (M2): Components

The money supply M2, (including currency in circulation, demand deposits, foreign currency deposits, time and savings deposits) increased to \$151.2 million in nominal terms during the first half of the 2002/03 financial year. This is a 14.0 percent increase compared with the 5.1 percent decline during the previous six months and the 13.6 percent increase in the same period of the preceding year. The growth in the money supply during the first half of the 2002/03 financial year was attributed mainly to a 41.0 percent increase in demand deposits and a substantial increase in foreign currency deposits which was more than doubled the level at the end of June 2002 (*Figure 8, S1, S2*).

Commercial Bank Lending

During the first half of the 2002/03 financial year, commercial banks credit increased by \$13.2 million to \$147.8 million, a 9.8 percent increase compared with the 13.1 percent increase during the previous six months and the 5.1 percent increase during the same period last year. Most of the increase in lending by the commercial banks during the period was directed to the private sector. The outstanding credit extended to the private sector increased by \$12.3 million to \$137.4 million, a 9.8 percent growth compared with the 11.0




Figure 9. Commercial Banks Private Sector Lending

percent increase during the six months ended June 2002 and the 4.6 percent increase during the same period last year. At the end of December 2002, credit to the industrial sector accounted for 48.2 percent of total outstanding credit, compared with 45.3 percent at the end of June 2002 and 46.8 percent at the end of December 2001. Commercial banks credit for housing accounted for 25.8 percent of total credit at the end of December 2002, compared with 25.2 percent at the end of June 2002 and 30.2 percent at the end of December 2001 (Figure 9, S15).

Non-Monetary Financial Institution (NMFI) Lending

Total credit extended by the NMFI rose by \$2.5 million to \$40.6 million over the six months ended December 2002. This was a 6.4 percent increase compared with the 5.1 percent

growth over the previous six months, and the 3.9 percent increase during the same period last year. At the end of December 2002, credit to agriculture and fishing accounted for 34.7 percent (34.9 percent in June 2002, 30.9 percent in December 2001), other industries 24.9 percent (24.6 percent in June 2002, 26.9 percent in December 2001) and private individuals (including housing) 39.5 percent (38.6 percent in June 2002, 39.8 percent in December 2001) (*S16*).

Published Deposit Interest Rates




Figure 10. Interest Rates

The nominal published annual interest rates on savings deposits reported by commercial banks remained unchanged during the first half of the 2002/03 financial year. However, the average weighted interest rate on saving deposits, at 3.14 percent was slightly higher, compared with 3.13 percent for both - the previous six months and the same period last year. The average weighted interest rate on term deposits at 5.72 percent was slightly lower than the 5.82 percent during the previous six months and 5.78 percent during the same period last year (*Figure 10, S 17*).

Lending Interest Rates

With the exception of interest rate for owner occupied housing loans, the commercial banks published lending rates remained unchanged during the six months ended December 2002. The published lending interest rate for owner occupied housing loans declined to 11.13 percent at the end of December 2002, from 11.25 percent at the end of June 2002 and December 2001. During the six months ended December 2002, the average weighted lending interest rate at 11.39 percent was lower than the 11.41 percent during the previous six months, but higher than the 11.34 percent during the same period last year.

The Non-Monetary Financial Institution (NMFI) published lending rates were revised for most of the categories at the end of December 2002. The business prime range lending rate was revised downward from a minimum of 10.5 percent to 10.0 percent and a maximum of

13.5 percent to 12.0 percent. At the same time its published lending interest rates for owner occupied housing loan was revised: the minimum rate remained unchanged at 11.0 percent while the maximum rate was revised upward from 13 percent to 15 percent (*S18*).

Overall in real terms, (after accounting for inflation) lending rates are positive while deposit rates are negative. This asymmetry leads to a distortion in the allocation of resources in the economy.

Government Bonds

At the end of December 2002 the stock of Government Bonds in circulation totalled \$20.9 million, of which 32.4 percent were held by the commercial banks. These bonds were issued at terms ranging from 2 years to 6 years, carrying an interest rate ranging from 5.0 percent per year in nominal terms, to 6.75 percent.

Bilateral Exchange Rates




Figure 11. End Period Bilateral Exchange Rates - Selected Currencies/TOP

In the first half of the 2002/03 financial year, the pa'anga depreciated against the New Zealand, Fijian, Australian, United States dollars and Japanese yen by 10.1 percent, 6.6 percent, 3.6 percent, 3.5 percent, and 4.2 percent respectively. On a year-on-year basis, the pa'anga depreciated against the New Zealand dollar by 21.4 percent, the Australian dollar by 10.0 percent, the Fijian dollar by 12.0 percent, the United States dollar by 1.0 percent and the Japanese yen by 10.7 percent (*Figure 11, S40*).

Nominal Effective Exchange Rate




Figure 12. Nominal and Real Effective Exchange Rate (June 1991 = 100)

At the end of December 2002, the nominal effective exchange rate, which refers to the average bilateral exchange rates weighted by current account shares, had depreciated further by 5.4 percent, compared with the level at the end of June 2002. This is higher than

the 2.1 depreciation over the same period of the previous year. This movement reflected the depreciation of the pa'anga against the New Zealand, Australian, and Fijian dollars and the Japanese yen over this period (*Figure 12, S42*).


Real Effective Exchange Rate

At the end of December 2002, the real effective exchange rate, which refers to the average bilateral exchange rates weighted by the current account shares and taking into account the inflation rate differentials, had appreciated by 2.6 percent compared with a 3.4 percent depreciation during the six months ended June 2002, and a 4.6 percent appreciation during the same period of the previous year. The appreciation of the real effective exchange rate during the first six months of the 2002/03 financial year, reflected the higher rate of inflation in Tonga compared to its major trading partners (*Figure 12, S42*).




Folau'eve'eva






Fakatata 4. Ivi 'Uhila (Kilouate '000)






Fakatata 7. Pa'anga talifaki 'a e pule'anga 'i muli mo e koloa humai








