Introduction

Economic developments in Tonga were mixed in the second half of 2005, with partial indicators suggesting that the recovery in GDP growth in 2004/05 is unlikely to be sustained. The export of agricultural produce, particularly squash, root crops and vanilla beans, were lower in the six months-ended December 2005, compared with a year earlier. Growth in construction appears to have eased from the rapid pace in 2004/05, while a fall in earnings from tourism points to softer growth in tourist-related sectors.

In contrast to production, indicators of demand were positive. Survey data points to strong growth in consumer spending, which was underpinned by rapid growth in private sector credit. Growth in credit remained at around 40 per cent for most of the second half of 2005. Much of the demand for goods spilled over into imports, which when combined with falls in exports and private remittances, resulted in a widening of the current account deficit and a fall in the level of official foreign reserves.

The payment of the first tranche of the civil service pay increase in November is likely to have added to demand pressures, though the full economic effects of the settlement are yet to be seen. It is certain that the impact of the increase in salaries for macroeconomic and external stability will be substantial. The salary increases can be expected to underpin higher imports and a deterioration in the balance of payments. Downward pressure on the level of foreign reserves will only heighten the country's vulnerability to economic and weather-related shocks. The substantial increase in salaries also places at risk the significant progress achieved in reducing inflation. In December, inflation fell to 6.8 per cent, the lowest level in over four years.

Against a background of unsustainable credit growth, strong wages growth and a likely fall in foreign reserves, the Reserve Bank in January 2006 imposed credit ceilings on individual banks. Such a move was believed to be in the best interests of ensuring long-term macroeconomic stability.

Overseas Economic Conditions

Global economic conditions improved in the second half of 2005, with the expansion broadening beyond the main engines of growth, the United States and China. GDP growth strengthened in Japan, as well as in the rest of Asia after easing in 2004 and early 2005. In the Euro area, the recovery in activity remained modest by global standards. Nevertheless, concerns of inflationary pressures and accelerating money supply growth prompted the European Central Bank to increase its policy rate by 0.25 percentage points to 2.25 per cent in December 2005.

In the United States, growth in activity was supported by gains in employment, firm growth in asset prices and favourable financial conditions. An easing in the pace of

growth in the December quarter, partly reflecting hurricane-related disruptions to activity, is expected to be short-lived. With generally solid economic growth, high levels of capacity utilisation and rising cost pressures, the Federal Reserve continued to increase the federal funds rate, raising the rate by one percentage point to 4.25 per cent over the second half of 2005. Core inflation, at under 2 per cent, remains contained, despite the substantial increase in world oil prices.

In China, an increasingly important trading partner, real GDP growth remained robust, increasing by just under 10 per cent in the second half of 2005 from a year earlier. Growth was driven by strong contributions from domestic demand as well as external demand. In Japan, Tonga's main export destination, GDP increased by 3.4 per cent over the second half of the year from a year earlier, the strongest rate of growth in over 10 years. The recovery remained supported by favourable labour markets and improvements in corporate profitability.

Economic activity slowed in two of Tonga's major Pacific trading partners. Australia recorded relatively subdued economic growth compared with earlier years, with modest consumption growth and soft dwelling investment offsetting strong growth in business investment. In New Zealand, GDP was flat over the second half of 2005 reflecting soft domestic demand amidst higher interest rates and rising fuel prices. With strong growth in credit for housing, continued buoyant house prices, and inflation above the Reserve Bank's target, the central bank increased its cash rate by 0.50 percentage points to 7.25 per cent at the end of December.

Elsewhere in the Pacific region, conditions were mostly positive. In Fiji, improved levels of income and accommodative financial conditions underpinned strong consumption growth, a deterioration in the trade deficit and a fall in the level of foreign reserves.

Domestic Economic Conditions


Agricultural Production

An increase in the volume of agricultural produce supplied to the Talamahu Market over the second half of 2005 points to a substantial increase in the supply of agricultural crops for the domestic market (Graph 1). The volume of produce supplied rose by 28 per cent over the year to the highest level in three years. The increase was broadly based across nearly all produce, with major contributions from watermelon and to a smaller extent, root crops and coconuts. The total value of produce supplied also rose by 28 per cent, suggesting little change in overall prices.

Trade data published by the Department of Statistics points to a disappointing export performance. The value of agricultural, marine and manufactured exports were considerably lower in the September quarter compared with a year earlier. While the

increase in produce supplied to the Talamahu Market suggests some diversion towards the domestic market, the quantities involved are likely to have been small. More recent data collected by the Reserve Bank from the commercial banks suggest disappointing returns from the squash harvest in the December quarter. This partly reflected lower prices, though mechanical problems with one of the shipments adversely affected volumes.

Graph 1: Talamahu Market Turnover




Fishing

Trade data from the Department of Statistics suggest that activity in the fishing industry remained subdued in the second half of 2005. The value of fish and other marine exports amounted to \$1.6 million in the September quarter 2005, the lowest level in four years over the corresponding period. Exports of fresh fish, which once formed the bulk of marine exports amounted to just under \$0.7 million, almost half the level of a year earlier and well below the peak of \$5.6 million in the September quarter 2003. Exports of other marine produce, which includes seaweed and coral rock, increased by around 12 per cent from a year earlier to \$0.9 million.

Bank lending data suggest that there is little investment being channelled into the industry. Lending to the fisheries industry fell to the lowest level in 3 years in December 2004, and in contrast to lending to other sectors, increased only modestly over 2005, remaining well below the levels of recent years.

Tourism

Indicators of tourism were mixed. According to overseas exchange transactions reported by commercial banks, earnings from tourism were subdued in the second half of 2005, falling by 17 per cent from a year earlier (Graph 2). While the size of the fall is puzzling, it would be misleading to attribute the fall to the termination in early October of flights by



Polynesian Airlines; total arrivals increased by just over 1 per cent, reflecting an increase of 7 per cent in the number of air arrivals. In contrast, the number of tourist arrivals by cruise ships, which tends to be volatile, fell by around a quarter. The increase in air arrivals reflected a large increase in visitors from Australia, though the number of visitors from New Zealand, the United States and other Pacific Island countries also increased firmly.

Recent developments suggest that the prospects for tourism are positive. The airline, Pacific Blue, commenced flights to Tonga in late October 2005, while a second domestic airline, Airlines Tonga, commenced flights in December 2005. The hosting of the Pacific Islands Forum in Nuku’alofa in October 2006 can also be expected to boost visitor numbers.

Construction

Construction activity eased from the high levels in 2004, reflecting the completion of several major non-residential building projects, most recently, the new wing at the Vaiola Hospital. According to a quarterly survey conducted by the Reserve Bank, sales of construction materials fell by 18 per cent in the six months-ended December from a peak in the second half of 2004, a trend that is consistent with the easing in construction-related credit from a peak in late 2004. Lending data for the December quarter pointed to some recovery in activity towards the end of the year.

Wholesale and Retail

Retail conditions were buoyant in the second half of 2005, following strong growth in 2004/05. According to a regular survey conducted by the Reserve Bank, covering vehicles, supermarkets and household goods, wholesale and retail sales increased by 13 percent in nominal terms from a year earlier. The high level of sales was consistent with the strong growth in lending to households for housing and personal items. Growth was broadly based across all categories of expenditure.

Electricity Consumption


In the six months ended December 2005, electricity consumption rose by a robust 14 per cent percent from a year earlier, reflecting a strong rise in usage per household and a relatively moderate rise in the number of households. The introduction of a government subsidy for household electricity usage in June 2005 may have been a factor behind the strong growth in consumption.

Inflation

Inflation eased in the second half of 2005, despite a large rise in world oil prices earlier in the year. Consumer prices increased by 6.8 per cent in the year-ended December 2005, the lowest sustained rate since the first half of 2001. Growth in the prices of most categories, particularly domestic food prices, eased, with the effects of higher world oil prices more than offset by the effects of a reduction in the rates of duty on imported cigarettes.

The fall in inflation was driven by an easing in the growth of domestic prices, which comprises one third of the total consumer price index. Domestic prices rose by 7.5 per cent in the year-ended December, well down from the 13.3 per cent rise in the year-ended June. The largest contribution to the fall came from food prices, which rose by 7.4 per cent in the year-ended December, compared with 18.2 per cent in the year-ended June. Lower growth in domestic transportation costs, also made a small contribution to the fall in inflation.


Prices of imported items rose by 6.3 per cent in the year-ended December, up slightly from the pace in the middle of the year. Increases in the prices of transportation costs, mainly vehicle fuel, as well as food, made the most significant contributions to inflation in the second half of the year, while lower prices growth on tobacco products and household appliances partly offset these rises.

Overseas Exchange Transactions (OET)

Overseas exchange transactions reported by banks point to strong growth in imports, falls in exports and net private remittances and a widening current account deficit.

The value of exports in the second half of 2005 fell by \$4.6 million over the year to \$15.4 million, largely reflecting lower receipts from agricultural exports, particularly squash. In contrast, the value of imports rose by \$19.1 million or 19.1 percent to an historic high of \$119.3 million, underpinned by strong growth in business and household credit. The fall in exports and strong growth in imports resulted in a trade deficit of \$103.9 million, the largest trade deficit in a six-monthly period (Graph 4).


Graph 4: Balance of Payments



Tonga's growing trade deficit has been funded over the years by an increase in net private remittances. The past year suggests that remittances can no longer be relied upon to fund the growing demand for imports when other sources of foreign exchange, notably exports

12-months moving sum




and capital inflow, are falling. After strong growth in the 2000-2004 period, net private remittances fell markedly over 2005, totalling \$167.1 million in 2005 (Graph 5).

Improvements in net receipts relating to services and investment were insufficient to offset the increase in the trade deficit and the fall in net remittances. The result was a current account deficit of \$13.4 million in the six-months ended December compared with a deficit of \$1.5 million a year earlier. A fall in capital inflow to \$13.0 million and unrecorded inflows of \$3.9 million resulted in a balance of payments surplus of \$3.5 million. This compares to \$3.6 million in the previous year.

Gross Official Foreign Reserves

At the end of December 2005, gross official foreign reserves amounted to \$85.7 million, equivalent to 4.6 months of imports (Graph 6). This is well below the peak of \$93.4 million or 5.4 months of imports in December 2004.

Domestic Financial Conditions


Financial conditions were accommodative in the second half of 2005. Total liquidity, a broad measure of money supply, increased by 18.4 per cent in the year-ended December 2005, well above the average annual growth rate of the past 10 years¹. The rapid growth in credit to the private sector and the risk of a large drop in the level of official foreign reserves prompted the Reserve Bank in January 2006 to impose credit ceilings on individual banks. The decision was taken to slow the growth of credit to a sustainable pace consistent with long-run economic growth and to protect the level of foreign reserves. Special considerations are given for loans to productive and foreign exchange earning sectors and loans that are critical for the economic and social activities of the country.

¹ The widest definition of money supply, total liquidity, comprises M1 (notes & coins and demand deposits), quasi money (savings deposits, term deposits and foreign currency deposits), as well as paper issued by the non-monetary financial institution and held by the non-bank public.

Strong growth in term deposits and savings deposits, which comprise the bulk of quasi money, were the main factors funding the increase in money supply over the second half of 2005 (Graph 7). Strong competition for deposits was particularly evident, as banks sought to lock in long-term funding amidst strong demand for credit and disappointing earnings from the export of squash. In contrast, currency in circulation and demand deposits, which comprise M1, made little contribution to money supply growth.

Graph 7: Contribution to Liquidity


Year-ended percentage change



The accommodative financial conditions were evident in the strong growth in credit (Graph 8). Total domestic credit increased by 39 per cent in the year-ended December, the highest rate of growth in 15 years. Households in particular were willing to take on higher levels of debt, with credit to households increasing by 48 per cent, one of the strongest rates of growth on record. While much of the lending was directed towards the construction of housing, personal loans also increased markedly.

Growth in credit to the business sector over the second half of 2005 was also at historically high levels, with credit increasing by 29 per cent in the year-ended December. Growth in business lending was broadly based across most sectors, with particularly strong growth to agriculture, wholesale & retail, hotels & restaurants and other services.

The government remained a net lender to the banking system, partly accommodating the expansion of credit to the private sector.

Interest Rates

Interest rates on savings deposits were largely unchanged in the second half of 2005 at around 3.25 per cent, while the interest rate on term deposits edged higher to 6.1 per cent. The maximum prime business lending rate remained at 11.5 per cent, while the interest rate on owner-occupied housing rose by 25 basis points to 10.5 per cent.

Government Bonds

At the end of December 2005, the stock of government bonds outstanding amounted to \$25.1 million, of which around 8 percent were held by the commercial banks. The bonds were issued at maturities ranging from 2 years to 5 years, with an interest rate ranging from 6.0 percent to 6.75 percent per annum.

The Tongan Pa'anga


The Tongan Pa'anga fell on a trade weighted basis in the second half of 2005, reflecting depreciations against all currencies that comprise the index (Table 1). The Pa'anga reached historic lows against the Fijian, New Zealand and Australian dollars.

The Real Effective Exchange Rate (REER) index of the Pa'anga, a measure of competitiveness which takes into account movements in the relative prices of Tonga's main trading partners, as well as movements in bilateral exchange rates, rose by 1.2 per cent in the second half of 2005 (Graph 9). A rise in the real effective exchange rate indicates a deterioration in Tonga's international competitiveness; the benefits from the nominal depreciation of the currency were more than offset by higher domestic inflation than in Tonga's trading partners, notwithstanding the substantial progress achieved over the past year.

Na'e feto'aki 'a e ngaahi fakalakalaka faka'ekonomika 'i Tonga 'i he konga hono ua 'o e 2005. Fakatatau ki he ngaahi me'afua faka'ekonomika 'e ni'ihi, ngalingali 'e 'ikai lava ke hokohoko atu 'a e tupu 'i he koloa ngaohi fakalotofonua 'a ia na'e a'usia 'i he 2004/05. Ko hono uta atu 'a e fua 'o e ngoue ki tu'apule'anga, tautefito ki he hina, ngoue foha mo e vanila, na'e ma'ulaloange ia 'i he mahina 'e ono 'o ngata ki Tisema 2005 'i hono fakahoa ki he ta'u kimu'a. Ko e tupu 'i he ngaahi ngaeue langa 'oku holo hifo ia mei he kake vave 'i he 2004/05, pea holo mo e pa'anga hu mai mei he takimamata 'a ia 'oku ha 'i he tupu mamalie 'a e ngaahi sekitoa felave'i mo e folau'eve'eva.

Ngaahi Tu'unga Faka'ekonomika 'i Tu'apule'anga

pea pehe ki he toenga ‘o e ngaahi fonua ‘i ‘Esia hili ‘ene holo ‘i he 2004 mo e konga kimu’ a ‘o e 2005. 






Kalafi 4: Palanisi 'o e fehu'aki pa'anga mo muli



Kalafi 6: Pa’anga Talifaki ‘a e Pule’anga ‘i Muli





Makatu'unga 'i he fu'u ma'olunga 'a e tupu 'i he ngaahi no ki he tafa'aki fakataautaha mo e fakafuofua 'e holo ki lalo 'a e lahi 'o e pa'anga talifaki 'a e pule'anga 'i muli, na'e hilifaki ai 'e he Pangike Pule ha fakangatangata fakalukufua ki he ngaahi no 'a e ngaahi pangikee 'i Sanuali 2006. 


